Let us listen to Scripture with the child Jesus and like him grow strong in wisdom.

#### God of love,

you are so much more than anything we could ever imagine. Abundant love flows from your very being. We know your love is the greatest of all. We bask now in that love, making our small offering in return. We love you with all our heart, all our understanding, and all our strength - and always will.

O God we thank you for your command to love, for every opportunity you give to us to love someone and for every time we have received love. But Lord God, we confess that we struggle to love others. Sometimes we don't even recognise who our neighbour is, never mind knowing how to love them, we confess we're not always sure what love is. Sometimes we delude ourselves into thinking we're behaving in loving ways when, in fact, we're just serving our own egos.

Sometimes we cut ourselves off from love because we're frightened it might change us. If we truly loved someone, if we truly loved you, would we lose our sense of who we are? If we truly made ourselves vulnerable, would we get taken advantage of? So we hold back. We make half-hearted gestures. We make grand sacrifices to show off our moral superiority. And all the while we miss the love we long for. Forgive us and heal us. Teach us to love through your eyes so that we may care for our neighbours and for our world. We speak the words known as the Shema together Help us to "Love the Lord our God with all our heart, with all our soul, and with all our might." (Deuteronomy 6:4-5) May these words be upon our hearts each day. Amen

Reading: Deuteronomy 6: 1- 9; Mark 12: 28-34 (later take time to read Leviticus 19).

Reflection: Loving one another is key

As we read today's gospel lesson we see that Jesus is still in the temple after hours of debate. Just imagine him standing in the outer Temple courts where all the doves are fluttering and the goats bleating. All oblivious to the fact that they are penned ready for sacrifice. The five hundred year old temple is the golden symbol of the rebirth of the nation after the exile, and was deemed to be holy in the eyes of all the Jews.



Jesus is in the middle court where people congregate, where gentiles and women are not allowed, but he can pass up more steps and across the paved courts to reach the Holy of Holies, the seat of God. Jesus is not a priest and must never go there. He stays with the people and does not distance himself from them. He has been preaching and teaching all day, challenged by the Pharisees and the Sadducees. Take a moment to feel yourself in the groups of people there. As you do so hear the noise of bleating and chirping in the background. Hear the voices echo in the temple court. Feel the rising levels of holiness and the sense of anticipation in the air.




When the teacher of the law comes over to speak to Jesus, he listens carefully and replies courteously. It is remarkable that Jesus never hesitates for a moment when asked which is the greatest commandment - there are 613 Jewish commandments to choose from. But as he answers everyone is focusing on his words - He is definite and specific in his reply. He states the Shema, the statement of Jewish Identity from Deuteronomy, which declares to the world that 'the Lord is One'. But Jesus' teaching goes further and is evident through his teaching and healing ministry.

There is a second piece of law that Jesus draws on here. It is also already known to the Jews and comes from Leviticus 19:18) but we as Christians understand that it came to us through Jesus because Jesus became flesh and took the path to the cross despite having the power and the recourses to walk away. This is not some vague choice of love, it is a particular love. Jesus links the Shema to loving our neighbour as much as we love ourselves. After hours of talking, teaching, controversy. Jesus in just these few words summarises his mission and silences his opposition.

To love God with the totality of our being, and to love the one near us (whoever that may be at any given moment) summarizes the entire law. To give ourselves sacrificially and unconditionally to God and to one another is what the commandments are all about. So if we keep parts of the law, but don't love God or people, then we have missed the whole point!

This questioner had a different spirit than the others. He understood that relationships are more important than rules. He understood that his relationship with God and his relationship with people trumped everything else. All He needed to do was put His trust in Christ, and then he would be IN the Kingdom of God, not just NEAR it.

Spend some time considering the abundance of goodness and happiness that we want for ourselves, our neighbours, how we can live accordingly. Such love doesn't mean just doing the occasional good turn. It requires constant openness to others, take down any barriers and excuses. How can we feel as deeply as that for people we hardly know, people who are beyond our small communities. What difference will all this make to our living and to our praying?
